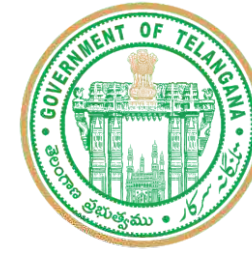

Please remain assured that my government will provide full support to you, and to make and maintain Hyderabad as the #1 destination for IT and ITeS companies.

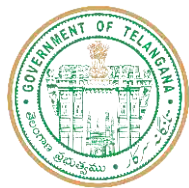

Located in the southern part of India, Hyderabad has risen rapidly to become a major global hub providing services to global organisations.

Thanks to its robust infrastructure, a vast and deep talent pool, a very supportive government and outstanding quality of life, Hyderabad has become the preferred destination for national and multinational organisations to set up and scale operations. In addition, proactive policy-making has made Hyderabad the best-suited city in India for sustainable growth.

In my three years of work here in Hyderabad as U.S. Consul General, I have seen the city consolidate its position as an important destination for several American businesses, especially in the field of information technology. Many American IT companies, including Microsoft, Google, Facebook, Apple, and Amazon have chosen Hyderabad as an investment location. I know from my interactions with representatives of these and many other American firms that they feel at home in Hyderabad because of this city's investor-friendly government, cosmopolitan and inclusive culture, and strong family links to the United States. The American IT companies in Hyderabad create an intellectual supply chain that will continue to spur economic growth in India, the United States, and the world.

Human Resources

Academic and research ecosystem: About 91% of the business heads with operations in Hyderabad rated the academic and research ecosystem available in the city as satisfactory. With 472 colleges, Hyderabad is among the top three cities for the **highest** number of colleges in India. It is also home to world-class institutes like Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Indian School of Business (ISB), Indian Institute of Information Technology (IIIT) and National Academy of Legal Studies and Research (NALSAR).

Talent pool: Hyderabad is rated among the top three destinations to attract talent in India. It has a total technology talent pool of almost 550K professionals, which has registered growth of 14.3% y-o-y growth during 2018-19. This, combined with low levels of staff attrition, led 87% business heads with operations in Hyderabad to rate the talent pool in the city very highly, especially for technology.

In a unique move, the government of Telangana has set up an initiative to help bridge the gap between talent and industry in the form of the **Telangana Academy of Skill and Knowledge (TASK)**. Working alongside the industry and academic institutions, TASK aims to reduce the costs incurred by companies in training their employees as well as improve the employability of the talent pool.

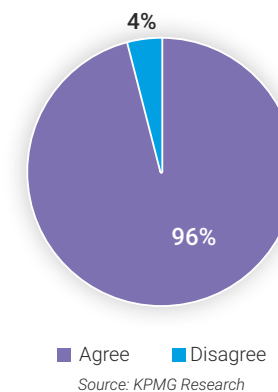
Business Growth:

The state of Telangana has almost doubled IT exports in the last five years. During 2018-19, IT/ ITeS exports registered an impressive growth rate (y-o-y) of **16.89%**, **almost double** compared with the expected national average of 8-10%. This exceptional growth is largely attributable to the growth of the businesses operating out of Hyderabad. About **93%** business heads have said that their Hyderabad office met and exceeded their growth expectations.

Infrastructure: To meet the growing demand, Hyderabad's office stock is expected to record a CAGR of 13.84% over the next three years and is likely to reach 90 million sq. ft. by 2021. In addition, ongoing infrastructure projects will ensure the improvement of infrastructure and connectivity. Future projects such as the Blockchain District, Technology Hub and Data Analytics Park ensure that Hyderabad is future ready.

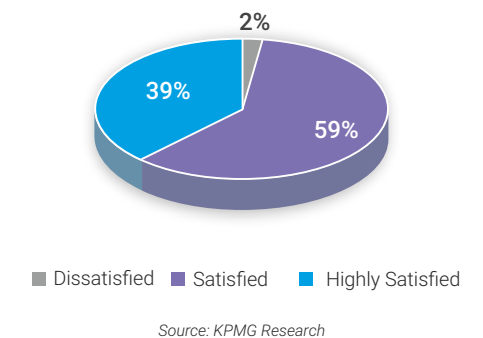
Operating out of Hyderabad

Proactive government: A large majority of business heads are extremely pleased with the government policies and incentives, which aid in running stable operations out of Hyderabad. The single-window clearance system guarantees that the application for setting up operations is processed in 15-30 days.

The government has been proactive in setting up an integrated IT ecosystem to ensure the smooth working and growth of the IT and ITeS companies in Hyderabad.

Another aspect that adds to the stability of operations out of Hyderabad is its location in a seismic safe zone and flood-free zone. Given that Indian cities have lately been prone to natural disasters, Hyderabad stands out due to its ability to provide sustained and low-risk business operations.

Political Stability



Business ecosystem: Hyderabad is home to several key technology companies like Microsoft, Google, Apple, Uber, Facebook and Amazon; most of these companies have their **second-largest workforce** outside of the US in Hyderabad. The city accounts for **13%** of all Global Capability Centres (GCCs) – in-house shared service centres of large global corporations – in India. There are 1000+ start-ups operating out of Hyderabad, making the city a thriving and innovative ecosystem with a mix of old and new world organisations.


Living in Hyderabad

Quality of life: In 2019, Mercer ranked Hyderabad as the best city to live in India for the fifth time in a row. Furthermore, among the metro cities in India, Hyderabad is ranked the second least polluted city and the second best in terms of traffic.

Safety: As per a survey by a leading newspaper, women rated Hyderabad as the **safest city in India**. The presence of bodies like Cyberabad security and SHE Teams ensures that the safety of the city is given the highest priority.

Livability: Compared with other metro cities in India, Hyderabad has the lowest cost of living, as well as relatively inexpensive and a broad array of housing options. About 98% of the business heads with operations in Hyderabad rated the culture and livability in the city as highly satisfactory. The presence of 10+ golf courses, 12 world-class stadiums and a vibrant nightlife further adds to the attractiveness of Hyderabad.



Business leaders have long recognised that finding the right talent is a valuable and scarce skill. Searching and onboarding the right talent costs time and money to businesses. In such a scenario, the availability of talent becomes vital for running a business.

The city of Hyderabad offers a rich and diverse talent pool and has managed to cater to every requirement of the constantly evolving business ecosystem.

Educational Institutions

Educational institutions are the source of fresh talent. Hyderabad has both quality and quantity to keep up with the growing demand of its business ecosystem. In terms of quantity, the college density (number of colleges per hundred thousand eligible population aged 18–23 years) for Telangana is 60, compared with the all-India average of 28. The admission to these colleges is through a highly competitive state-level examination, Telangana State Engineering, Agriculture and Medical Common Entrance (TS EAMCET), ensuring the consistently high quality of students entering these premier institutions.

The National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) – a central Indian government organisation that assesses and accredits higher education institutions in India – has accredited the University of Hyderabad as grade A. Below is a brief list of other world-class institutes in Hyderabad

These data points are mirrored by the experience of business leaders based in Hyderabad. About **91% business heads** with operations in Hyderabad are satisfied with the academic and research ecosystem in the city.

Talent Pool

Hyderabad boasts a rich technology talent pool consisting of almost 550K IT and ITeS professionals with **14.3% y-o-y growth** during 2018-19. It hosts a variety of skills – from voice to AI/RPA and product-specific R&D. One of the major positives observed in the talent pool is the premium quality of IT talent, which along with supportive state government policies results in a rich and empowered talent pool to cater to every need of businesses operating in Hyderabad.

On top of the vastly rich technology talent pool, the availability of non-engineering colleges under world-class universities like the University of Hyderabad and Osmania University significantly adds to the talent pool for skills required in the ITeS industry. In fact, with **472 colleges**, Hyderabad has the **third-highest** number of colleges in any district in India.



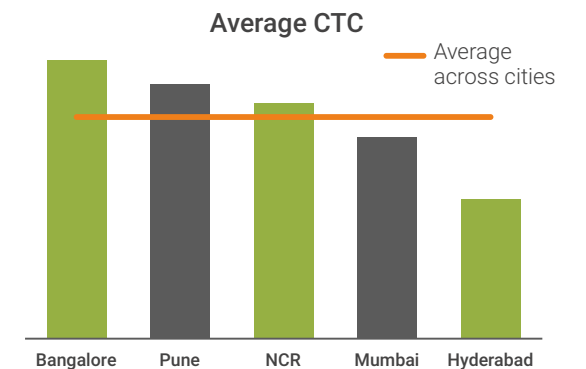

One of the major drivers of the talent pool availability for any organisation is the ability to attract talent from all over the country. Hyderabad has been able to excel in this area owing to its robust infrastructure and ease of living.

Salary Trends

The salary trends in Hyderabad are one of the most attractive for firms planning to set up business or expand their existing business in Hyderabad. When compared to other metro cities, Hyderabad's salary rates are approximately **10% lesser** for typical IT roles and approximately **15-20% lesser** when also considering other non-tech roles

The cost of talent (average CTC) corresponds to only **40%** of the commensurate revenue generated. The salary figures also correspond to the low cost of living in Hyderabad – whether it is rental cost or just the cost of purchasing goods. This enables both companies and employees to enjoy the benefits of lower prices.

In a city-wise study done by HR consulting firm Kelly Services, it was found that, against a national attrition rate of 16.3%, **the attrition rate in Hyderabad was the lowest (11%)** when compared with other metro cities: Bangalore (19%), Delhi (18%), Chennai (15%), Mumbai (14%) and Kolkata (12%).

The Telangana Government has set up effective programs such as TASK, that has helped to improve the talent pool and T-hub that facilitates dialogue with the start-up ecosystem in the state. We look forward to continuing this collaboration with the Telangana Government and set new standards for the public and private sector partnerships.

Language Skills

As an overall trend, there has been a greater focus on delivering customer-centric services – one major driver for that is delivering services compatible with the native language of their client organisations. Hyderabad has various institutions providing foreign language training. These institutes aid the current talent pool to explore possibilities and become fluent in foreign languages, helping them become valuable resources in the job market. Below are the institutes and the languages they cater to:

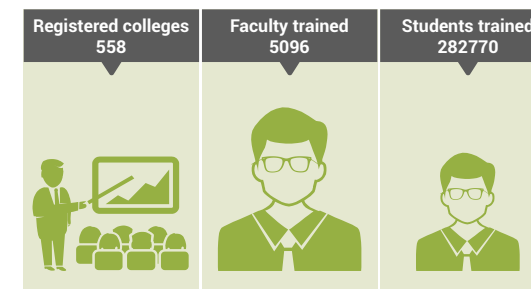
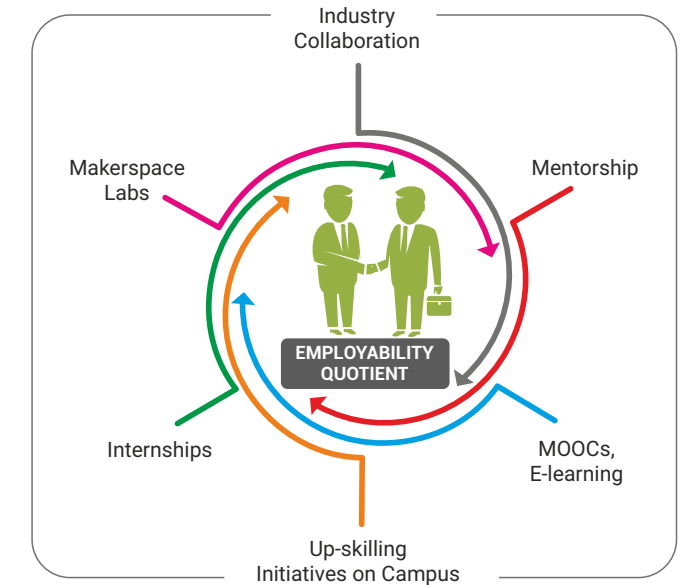

Bridging the Gap between the Talent Pool and the Industry

Hyderabad has implemented unique initiatives to minimise the gap between the talent pool and the industry.

TASK (Telangana Academy of Skill and Knowledge)

TASK aims to enhance synergies between the government, industry and educational institutions. It is a one-of-a-kind organisation with no parallel in any other Indian state.



The ideology behind TASK is to reduce the high costs incurred by companies in training and retraining their employees, as well as to improve the employability of graduates. To enhance the employability quotient, TASK provides an 8–12-week finishing school programme for recently graduated students, providing technical, organisational and personal skill training. The overall placement percentage of the finishing school is more than 61%.

Indian Institute of Technology Hyderabad

- Terra Drone corporation, world's one of the largest drone solutions providers and IIT Hyderabad has established a Centre of Excellence for research and development of unmanned aerial vehicles for uses in communication, agriculture, transportation and AI.
- Cyient a global leader in engineering design services has signed a MoU with IIT-H to undertake joint R&D and consultancy projects.
- A team from IIT-H is part of the international body that sets communication protocol standards & had indigenously developed the waveform technology that forms the backbone of uplink of 5G networks.

Industry Connects with Institutions

International Institute of Information Technology, Hyderabad

- Microsoft Garage, the division which promotes in-house innovation projects has partnered up with IIITH to run a program on quantum computing.
- IIIT Hyderabad and Bharat Dynamics Limited, the state run defense company is collaborating in a Center of Excellence for exploring the usage of AI in missile technology.
- European Union is collaborating with IIITH in establishing a center of Excellence to develop IoT solutions for smart cities.
- Amazon is collaborating with IIITH to develop analytics based techniques in sports. This has the potential to improve the performance of professional sportspeople in a disruptive way

Indian School of Business Hyderabad

- A multinational Information Technology company has signed an outcome based research agreement with ISB Hyderabad for research on mathematical modeling techniques and social networks
- Centre for Analytical Finance collaborates with knowledge repositories like Bloomberg, Thomson Reuters, Morningstar to conduct knowledge sharing sessions
- ISB also engages with industry at events hosted throughout the year. It aids the business ecosystem by virtue of talent, research and advanced management programs like Business Analytics, Healthcare, Infrastructure etc.

J-Hub

As the business ecosystem becomes increasingly competitive, problem-solving and innovation are considered vital. One of the ways, Hyderabad's biggest university JNTU has tackled this challenge is by the introduction of J-Hub. The JNTUH - Innovation Hub (J-Hub) is a dedicated facility to provide access to resources to students, staff, alumni and entrepreneurs to support university-wide R&D and innovation. JNTU also leverages a changing curriculum to ensure topics such as innovation and entrepreneurship are taught at the undergraduate level.



J-Hub

The Innovation Hub offers access to its stakeholders, a spectrum of programs, experts, labs, equipment, collaborators, networks and spaces to catalyze innovation, knowledge intensive businesses and tech-enterprises.

Other initiatives under J-Hub include:

a. Hackathons: J-Hub organises Hackathons based on the challenges faced by the industry and start-ups in the form of two league events per year. The students are provided mentorship from both the university and industry. J-Hub has ties with many industry leaders including the Confederation of Indian Industries (CII). The following are a few winning projects:

- Suraksha MAA:** It is an innovative app that helps pregnant women keep track of their health.
- EDUPAD:** It aids visually challenged people in learning technical descriptions through voice assistant-based electronic device and writing machine.

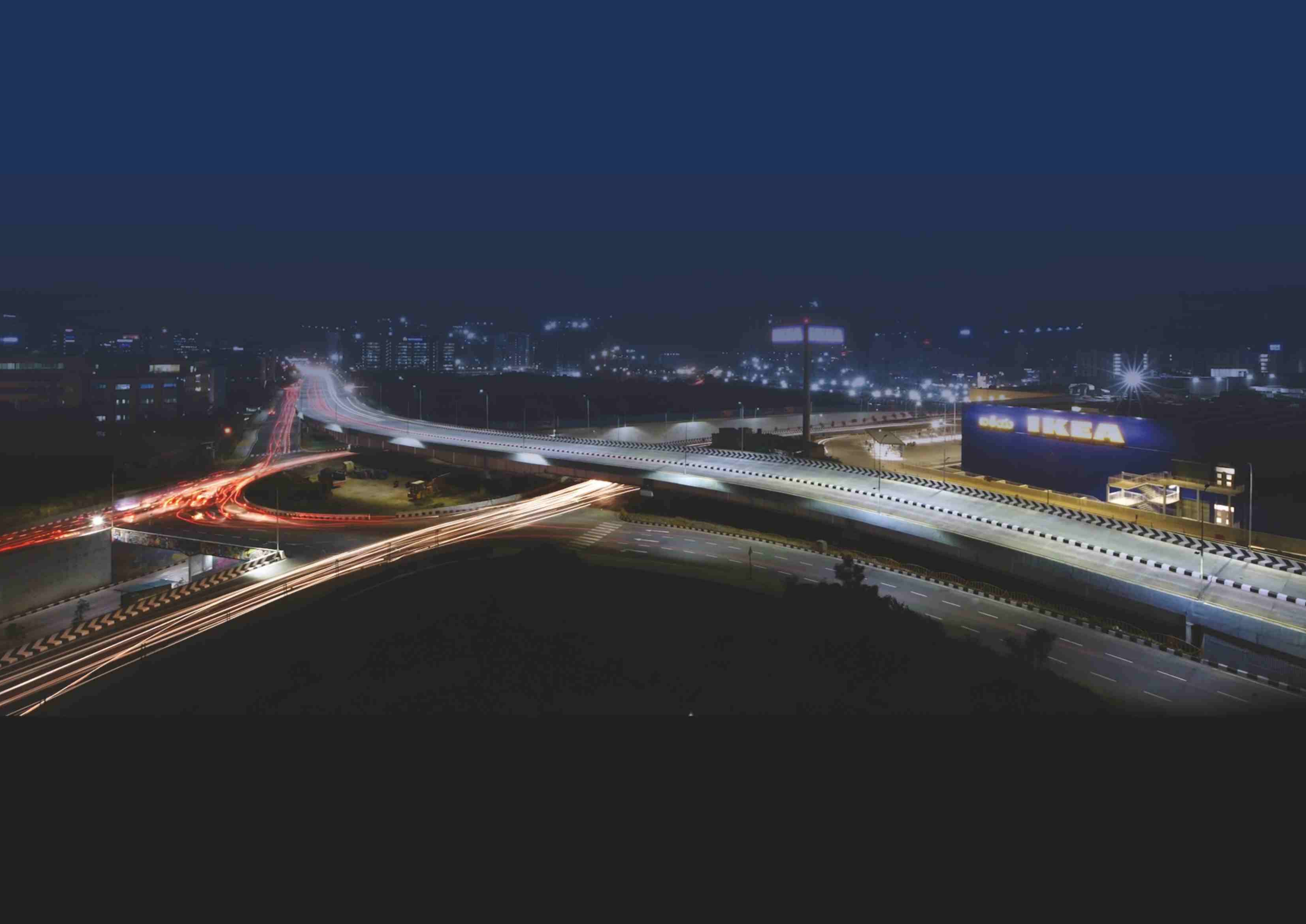
b. Incubation facility: J-Hub also provides incubation facility for students and alums at a very nominal rate. In addition to facilities like prototyping lab, conference space and technology workshops, the collaborative space helps ideas flow among budding entrepreneurs, enabling them to maximise their innovation potential.

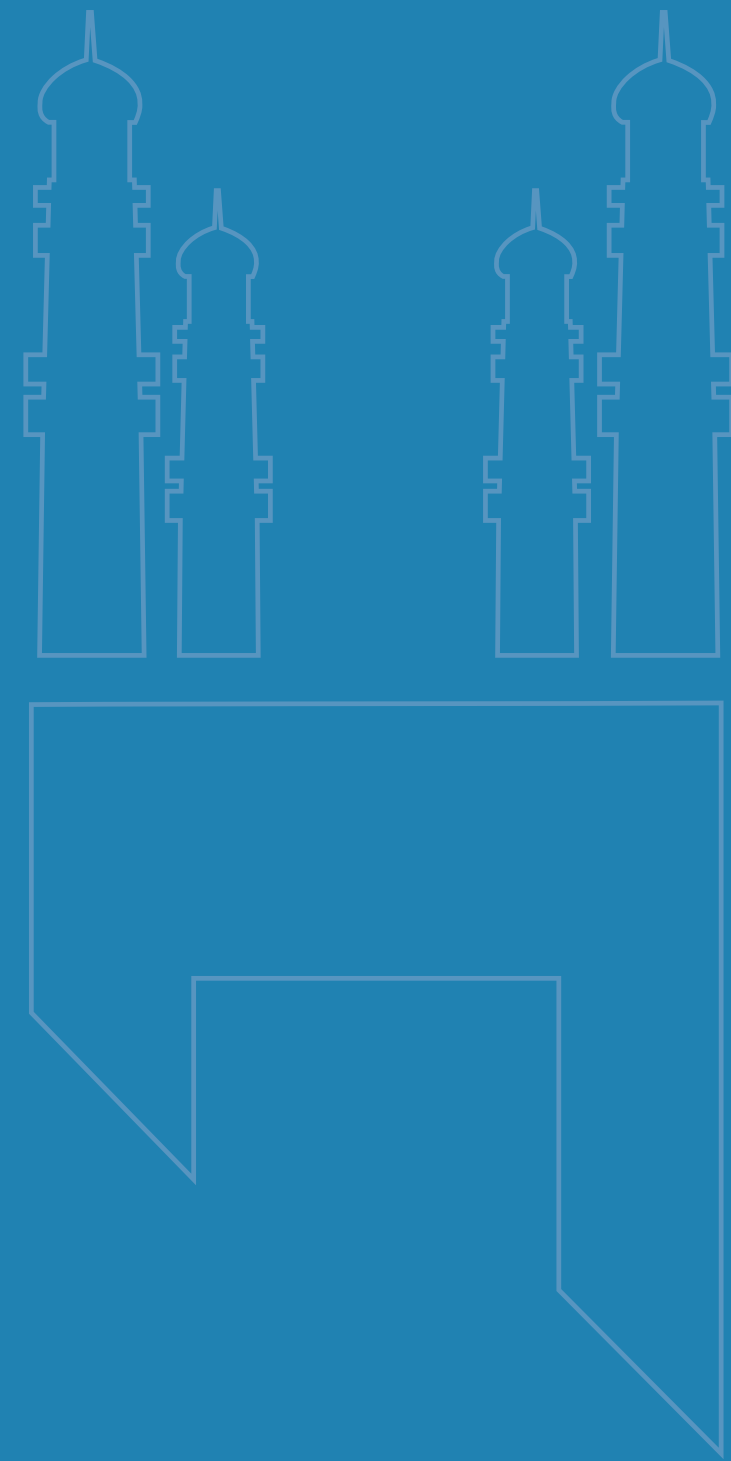
Secondary Avenues for Skill Development

In addition to the existing talent infrastructure and finishing schools like TASK, Hyderabad also has secondary avenues for skill development that act as huge hubs for training facilities and skilling of talent. Such hubs are home to IT skill institutes which conduct classes for more than 100,000 students in various technologies such as Cloud Computing, Advanced Analytics, Blockchain, IoT and SAP. These institutes enhance the employability of the students by making them ready for the IT/ITeS industry and act as a secondary source of talent.

SUPERIOR INFRASTRUCTURE OF THE CITY

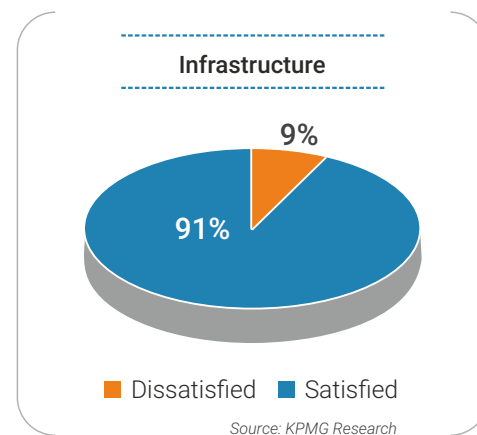
A fast growing urban economy, ranked in the top 3 by the World Bank for Ease of Doing Business in India, Hyderabad is centrally located with well-developed infrastructure. The city hosts Google's largest office outside the US along with Microsoft, Facebook, Deloitte and Oracle. India's leading research hubs CCMB, IICT, NGRI, Defense, Electronics and Aerospace offer numerous opportunities across industries.

The Australian Government has had trade representatives in the city since 2002 and an office was opened in 2010. We consider Hyderabad an essential destination for Australians doing business in ICT, Life Sciences, Resources and Infrastructure.

The existing infrastructure and its scalability are the most important aspects when evaluating the business attractiveness of a city. This view has been reinforced by the findings of our survey. Of the five parameters (Talent, Infrastructure, Livability, Political stability and Business Ecosystem drivers), business heads in Hyderabad voted 'Infrastructure' as the most important aspect for deciding Hyderabad as their preferred business destination.

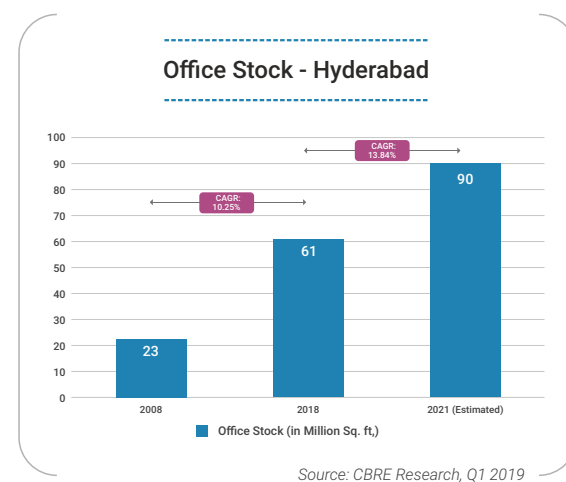
The infrastructure related to power has improved dramatically in the past 5 years. Telangana has increased its installed power generation capacity to 16,506 MW in 2019 from 7,778 MW in 2014. This has ensured that the organizations based out of Hyderabad get stable, high quality, and uninterrupted power supply - making Hyderabad an attractive business destination.

Upcoming infrastructure projects, including the upgraded Metro project, a suspension bridge (which would be the longest in the country) to ensure faster connectivity into downtown Hyderabad and a 1500-acre 'airport city', are expected to improve business infrastructure and connectivity in the coming years.



Evolution of Hyderabad as a Tech Hub

Hyderabad was one of the first cities to embrace the tech boom in India. Its growth began with the establishment of the Hyderabad Information Technology and Engineering Consultancy City (HITEC City) in 1998. In 2005, the government established the Financial District, a 150-acre dedicated industrial park as an extension of the HITEC city, and the city has been growing ever since. Office stock in Hyderabad has been growing at a substantial rate over the past decade and is expected to register a CAGR of 13.84% in the next three years to reach approx. 90 million sq. ft. by 2021.



Cost / Capacity Comparison against Other Indian Cities

Apart from providing low-cost and skilled talent, Hyderabad also offers space at one of the most competitive rates in the country. In addition, 30 million sq. ft. of upcoming quality supply is lined up for completion over the next 2-3 years in Hyderabad, higher than most cities in APAC. Thus, relatively higher availability of low-cost space and a skilled talent base are expected to attract occupier interest in the coming years.

Below is a snapshot of the comparators on rental cost for Hyderabad against other major Indian cities. With monthly rent as low as INR 60 / sq. ft. (as of Q1 2019), Hyderabad is one of the least expensive cities in terms of leasing infrastructure. Below is a comparative view of rents in other metro cities with the rate of Extended IT corridor in Hyderabad taken as 1x:

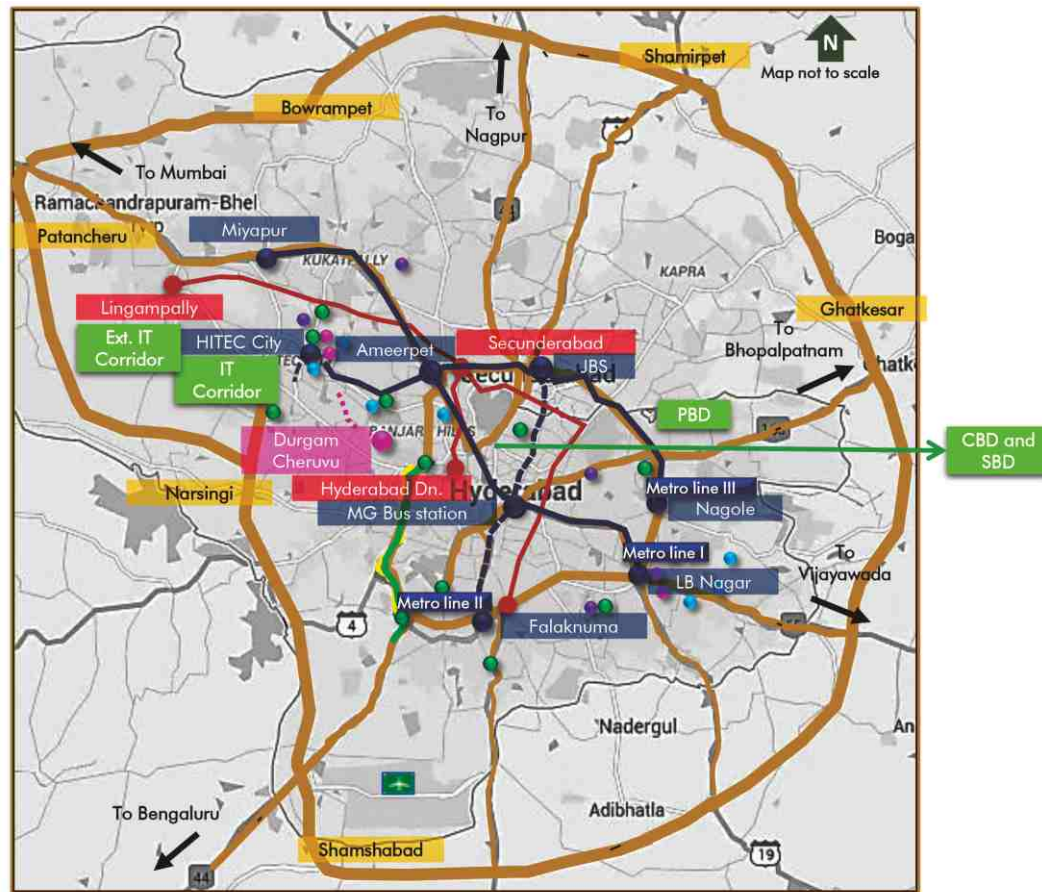

Prominent Government Policies

As the tech sector continues to be one of the key drivers of economic growth in the city, the Telangana government released the 'Telangana Information and Communication Technology (ICT) Policy Framework', to further promote the sector.

To boost the tech sector, the government of Telangana has drafted the 'Look East Policy' for East Hyderabad. Under this policy, new setups will receive subsidies for power and rent. It is also proposed that companies will get recruitment assistance and their employees will get discounts on metro rail passes. In addition, companies choosing the eastern part of Hyderabad will be exempt from impact fee and stamp duty for lease / registration.

Other policies highlighting the government initiatives have been highlighted in the 'Doing Business' section of the report.

In addition to these policies, the Telangana government has been actively involved in establishing new clusters across the state, especially in Hyderabad. The following table lists some of the government initiatives planned in and around Hyderabad over the past few quarters:

Office Sector Supply, Demand and Vacancy Trends (Last Five Years)

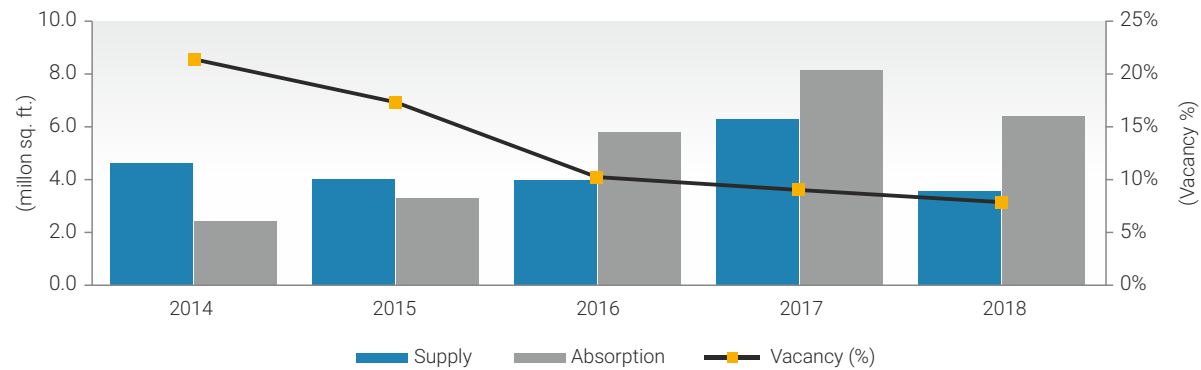
During 2014–18, Hyderabad added about 20 million sq. ft. of office space, mainly in the IT Corridor and Extended IT Corridor. In addition, the rising number of SEZs in the city played a key role in its growth; the share of SEZs in the city's office supply rose from almost 40% in 2014 to more than 60% in 2018.

Annual office leasing activity in Hyderabad almost tripled during 2014–16. During 2014–18, the city recorded about 26 million sq. ft. of space take-up, thereby becoming one of the leading office destinations in India. This rise in absorption was led by several corporates from diverse sectors taking up large-sized spaces.

Similar to supply, the IT Corridor and Extended IT Corridor remained dominant micro-markets driving space take-up. Moreover, leasing in SEZs was reported at about 40% during 2014–18, which rose to almost half in 2018 alone.

Moreover, in Q1 2019, Hyderabad was the top destination for occupiers leasing space in the country, overtaking Bangalore. This was mainly due to the closure of large-sized deals in the city's IT parks and SEZs. Also, the city witnessed a significant increase in supply addition on a quarterly basis with 4.9 million sq. ft. becoming operational. Majority of this newly completed supply witnessed the culmination of large-sized pre-commitments.

Hyderabad office sector dynamics

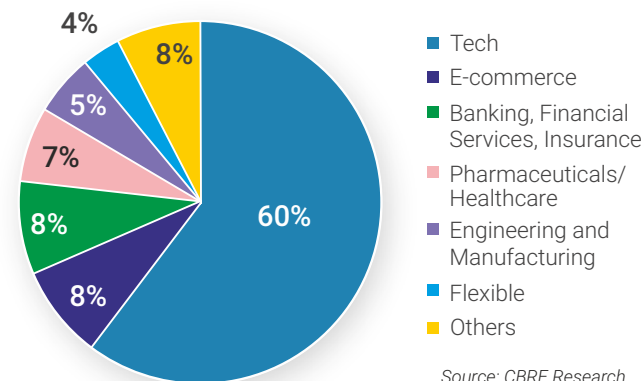

Prominent Sectors Leasing Space in Hyderabad (2018)

In 2018, tech corporates (with a 60% share) drove office space take-up in the city, followed by e-commerce (8%), BFSI (8%), pharmaceuticals / healthcare (7%) and engineering & manufacturing (5%) firms. In addition, flexible space operators remained active in the city, accounting for about 4% of the space take-up in 2018. Such deals included space take-up by domestic players such as Table Space, iSprout and Workafella.

Comparison of Hyderabad Office Trends vs Other Tier 1 Cities

Hyderabad is a key office destination in India, contributing about 10% and 14% of the country's annual supply and take-up, respectively, in 2018. Moreover, Hyderabad accounts for about **11% of the country's total office stock** (as in Q4 2018) and is the fifth-largest office market in the country. In addition, with a significant office pipeline (more than 30 million sq. ft.) lined up over the next three years, the city's stock is likely to cross **90 million sq. ft. by 2021**.

Future Trends in IT Office Space

The city is expected to witness office demand from new-age segments such as flexible space operators and e-commerce firms. Policy thrust in areas such as gaming and animation, start-ups, innovation policy, data analytics and data centres is also expected to help expand the city's office sector.

With necessary infrastructure in place, occupiers are now focusing on establishing presence in core micro-markets of the IT and Extended IT Corridors. Significant new supply is expected to be released in the next three years, mostly in core micro-markets. These high-quality, investment-grade projects are expected to serve large-sized requirements of leading global / domestic corporates. Healthy demand-supply dynamics are expected to strengthen rents, particularly in core micro-markets.

Corporates are thus expected to pre-commit space in under-construction developments to safeguard against future rent revisions.

About one-third of the upcoming supply lined up for completion over the next 2–3 years in Hyderabad consists of SEZs. SEZs, typically offer single-ownership, large-sized, contiguous space options for corporates, particularly those aiming at large-scale consolidation / expansion. This is expected to sustain demand for SEZ space in the city. Corporates that have traditionally favoured SEZs or those looking for large-scale consolidation spaces in Hyderabad are likely to be the primary clientele of this segment.

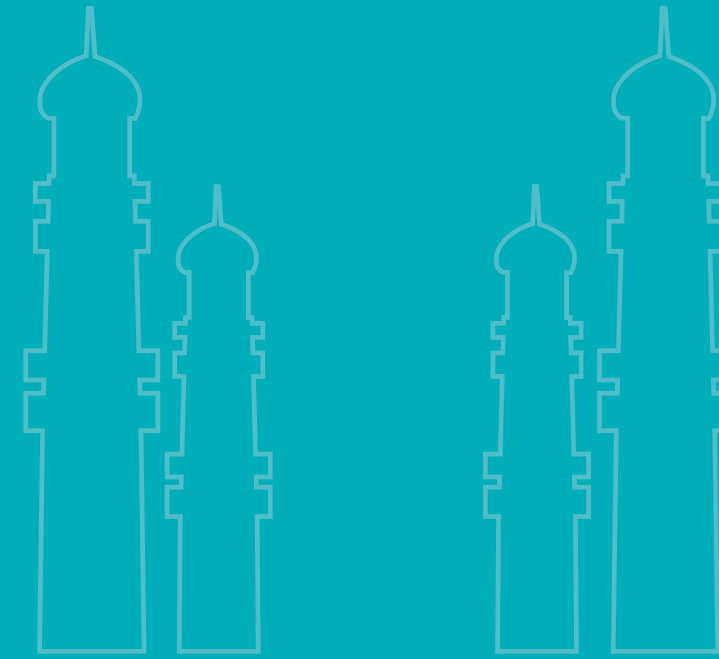
Thus, positive occupier interest towards setting up operations in quality SEZs and tech parks is expected to boost leasing activity in Hyderabad.

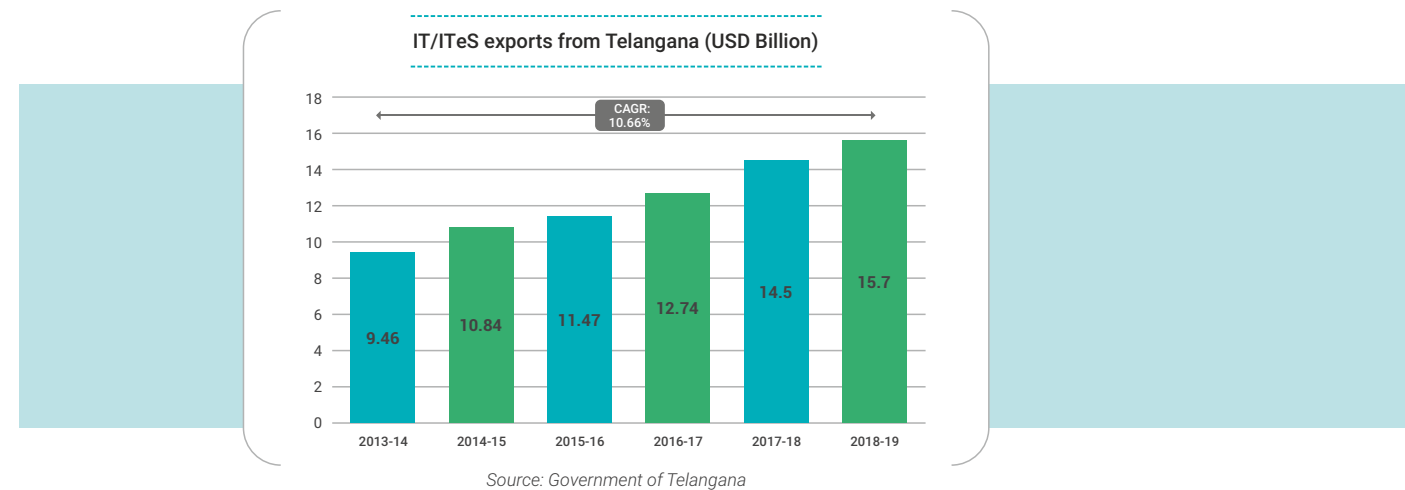


Business Ecosystem Highlights

BUSINESS ECOSYSTEM HIGHLIGHTS

Telangana, led by Hyderabad, has almost doubled IT exports in the last five years. The record growth in the sector has also led to large-scale employment generation in the sector, with the number of new employees in IT and ITes industries going up by 14.2% to reach around **550K people**. Hyderabad has GDP per capita growth of 8.7% – making it the **highest growing metropolitan area among the emerging Asia Pacific markets**.

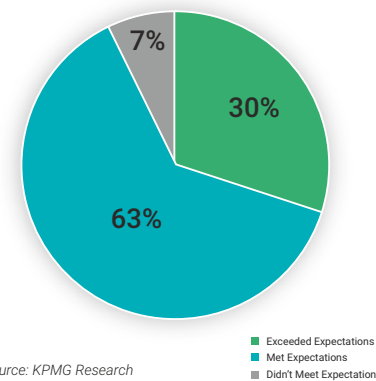
This exceptional growth has been largely attributable to the growth of the businesses operating out of Hyderabad.



With the numbers backing up, Hyderabad is one of the highest growing and the most promising locations for organisations looking to set up shop in India. There are a number of key technology companies operating from Hyderabad, including Google, Apple, Uber, Facebook and Amazon; most of these companies have their **second-largest workforce** outside of the US in Hyderabad. In recent years, there has also been considerable uptake in terms of new GCCs (Global Capability Centers – in-house shared service centers of large global corporations) getting set up with **13% of GCCs in India based in Hyderabad** and **12%** of the approximately 1 million total GCC talent in India.

Hyderabad is also a preferred destination for datacentres because of its central location, robust infrastructure, talent availability and location in a seismic safe zone and flood-free area. The government has a special IT policy for datacentres and offers unique incentives. Due to these benefits, **India's first Tier 4 datacentre** was setup in Hyderabad. Moreover, India's largest ecommerce players – Flipkart and Amazon – have recently opened multiple datacentres in the city.

How well has your Hyderabad office met your business growth plans till date?



Even though all these accolades point to Hyderabad being a giant in the IT sector, the city has much more to offer in terms of the business ecosystem. Hyderabad has the second highest proportion of MNCs in **software and semiconductor verticals**, mirroring its growth as the next Hi-Tech hub.

We began our operations in Hyderabad in 2002, and since then it has been one of our fastest growing centers with headcount doubling in the last 4 years. Our growth has been possible thanks to the unique advantages the city offers – excellent educational institutions producing high quality talent, conducive ecosystem for investments, support from government bodies and global connectivity.

In addition to being a great technology hub, in recent years, Hyderabad has also become a hub for financial and banking services, investment management companies and investment banking operations. This has been possible due to the high talent availability from CA, CFAs, CPAs, to MBA grads.

In the recent past, thanks to government initiatives such as setting up of a 'Financial District', the number of Financial Services companies establishing operations in Hyderabad has increased. Companies like Franklin Templeton, JP Morgan Chase Bank and Wells Fargo have a big presence in Hyderabad. In addition, owing to the availability of niche finance talent, Berkadia (a Berkshire Hathaway company) has set up its **only office** outside the US in Hyderabad.

It is also worthwhile to mention the pharmaceutical cluster in Hyderabad, which constitutes one of the biggest life science sectors in Asia. There are more than 800 pharma, biotech and med tech companies in Hyderabad. Genome Valley, spread over 600 sq. km., houses six of the world's top R&D companies in life sciences and three of India's largest vaccine manufacturers. The Telangana government plans to set up 'Pharma city' in Hyderabad with a total area of 19,000 acres, which will be the world's largest integrated ecosystem for life sciences.

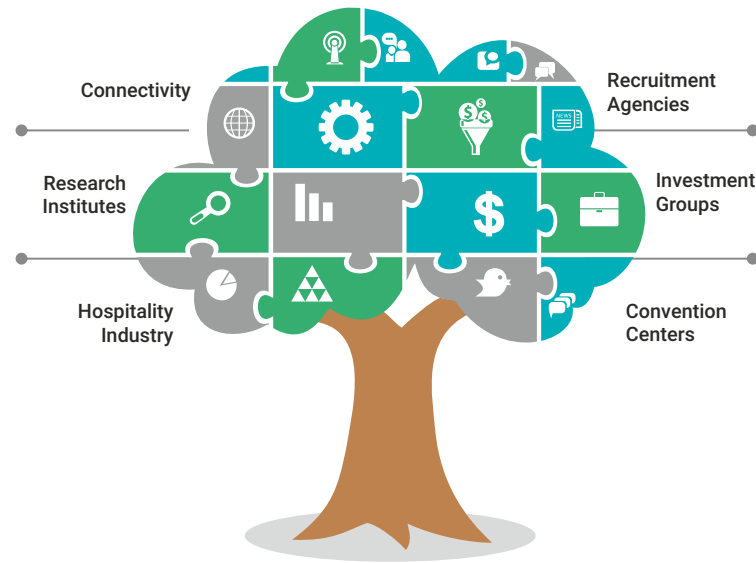

Ecosystem Drivers

Even though ecosystem drivers such as the availability of investment groups and recruitment agencies are not the main factors why an organisation chooses a particular city for its operations, these are vital as they enable the smooth functioning of a business. Hyderabad ticks all those boxes and is home to a thriving ecosystem of various entities that make it an ideal business hub.

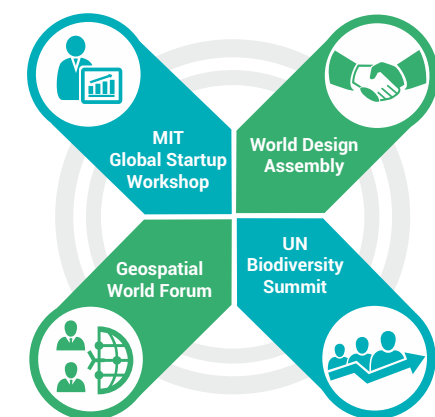


Investment groups: Investment groups form a key pillar for bolstering a startup-friendly culture and Hyderabad has a multitude of investment groups that provide a great support system. As a push to the start-ups in Hyderabad, the Telangana government set up an exclusive investment arm to invest in start-ups known as the 'T-Fund'. The fund kicked off investment activity in late 2017 with an initial corpus of INR 1 billion. In addition to the support from the government, there are other investment bodies like the Hyderabad Angels that provide the start-up ecosystem the necessary push towards success.

Recruitment agencies: Hyderabad has a large number of HR consultancy firms that assist the companies in finding the right talent. A number of these consultancy firms specialise in IT and ITeS industries.

Air connectivity: Hyderabad is emerging as one of the major transit hubs of South Asia. One can reach 123 international destinations around the world including 18 major US cities with a one-hop flight.

Convention centre: Hyderabad, with its high-tech convention facilities, wide network of professionals and unmatched hospitality is the preferred meeting place for business executives. The Hyderabad International Convention Centre (HICC) is one of the biggest convention centres in India with a seating capacity of 5000, and hosts over 500 events annually. Adding to the venues, there is a new convention centre coming up adjacent to HICC. The presence of multiple state-of-the-art convention centres make Hyderabad one of the top Meetings, Incentives, Conferences and Exhibitions (MICE) destinations in India.



Events: Hyderabad has hosted many prestigious events – this is an indicator of the world-class facilities the city has to offer. One of the biggest events was the 8th Global Entrepreneur Summit, which was presided over by India's Prime Minister Narendra Modi and US President's daughter and adviser Ivanka Trump. Even the World Congress on Information Technology (WCIT) – one of the largest and most prestigious ICT events in the world – was held for the first time in India in 2018 and the city of choice was Hyderabad.

Hospitality industry: The hospitality industry in Hyderabad is thriving. With over **6772 rooms (8.3% y-o-y growth during FY18)** in various price segments, and an average occupancy of less than 70%, a business traveller to Hyderabad always has ample options to choose from for a comfortable stay close to his or her workplace.

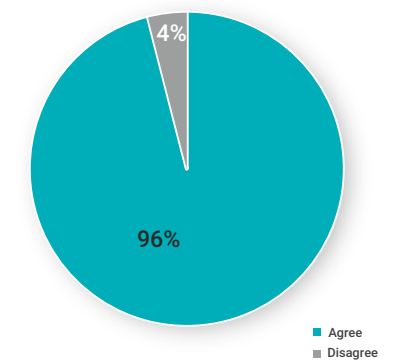
Research institutes: Hyderabad is home to some top research institutes. Below is a brief view on the major research institutes located in Hyderabad:

- Indian School of Business (ISB):** ISB faculty has contributed to the research output from India over the last few years. The faculty members have published articles in over 70 top-tier journals in different management areas. Some of the areas where the ISB faculty have been conducting research and have published are: Strategy, Organisational Behaviour, Finance and Economics, Information Systems, Marketing, and Operations Management.
- NALSAR:** It is a leading institute working on cutting-edge research on Intellectual property rights.
- IIIT Hyderabad:** It has been at the forefront of technology with a dedicated research centre, bringing together experts from various backgrounds to conduct research and development. Its focus areas range from machine learning and robotics research to data sciences and analytics.
- IIT Hyderabad (IIT-H):** It has collaborated with more than 20 Japanese universities and various industries. Extensive research is being done on emerging technologies such as 5G communication systems, nano-science and technology, and IoT. IIT-H recently conducted the world's first large-scale field trial demonstration of 'Generalised Precoded OFDM' technology and this feature is expected to be incorporated into the global 5G standards shortly

Innovation and start-up ecosystem: Hyderabad has seen a surge in the start-up ecosystem, with **1000+ start-ups** currently operating out of the city. In terms of ecosystem, T-Hub in Hyderabad, the largest incubator for start-ups in India, is one of the largest growing start-up ecosystems in the world, and it is well poised to make Hyderabad a start-up hub of the future. Further, educational institutes have helped foster innovation and entrepreneurship. IIIT-Hyderabad has set up a dedicated Centre for Innovation and Entrepreneurship (CIE), and IIIT Seed Fund. Incubators such as We-Hub and Technology Business Incubator in the University of Hyderabad provide guiding force for entrepreneurs. About **93%** of the business heads with operations in Hyderabad are either satisfied or highly satisfied with the city's innovation-friendly ecosystem.

Business leaders consider the business ecosystem of Hyderabad to be extremely robust and believe it is capable of supporting future growth.

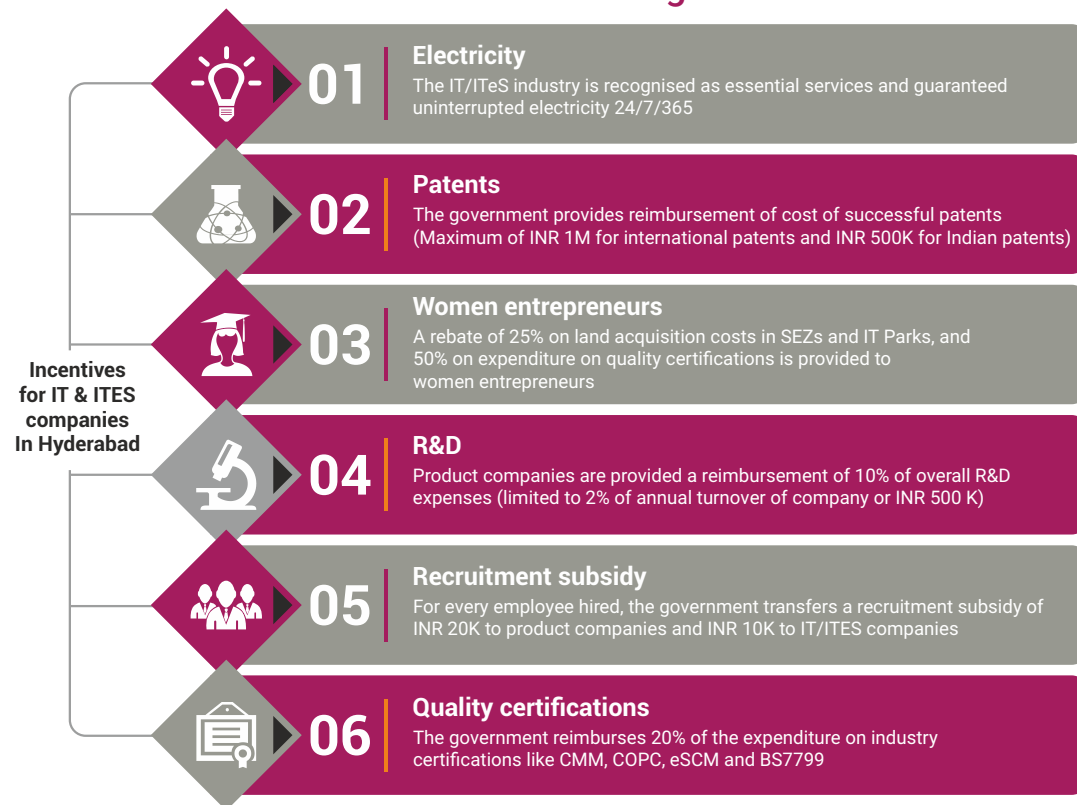
The Telangana government has also recognised the importance of maintaining a thriving start-up ecosystem and introduced several policies exclusive to start-ups. Below are the incentives that the government provides to IT and ITeS companies operating out of Hyderabad:

Hyderabad has played a crucial role in our journey. Ease of doing business



Hyderabad is one of the major transit hubs of South Asia. A total of 123 international destinations, including 18 US cities, are connected to Hyderabad by flights with one hop. Connectivity to Europe is ensured via daily direct flight to Heathrow – London.



Recognising its strategic importance, the Telangana government has made investments in terms of providing subsidies and expediting the documentation processes related to setting up operations in Hyderabad. It is due to the single-window clearance that application for setting up a new company is done in a span of 15–30 days. IT companies save on documentation and are also given incentives to use renewable energy sources.

The government recognises that IT/ITeS companies serve global customers on a 24x7x365 basis and therefore, this industry is regarded as essential services under which women are provided a general permission for three shift operations, including working at night. This has been possible thanks to the initiatives the government has taken to make Hyderabad a safe city for women to work in.

SEZs

SEZs or Special Economic Zones recognise effectiveness in trade and exports. The state of Telangana, with 29 operational SEZs, has one of the highest number of SEZs in India - attracting an increasing number of businesses.

The following are the various incentives for the companies operating in SEZs:

- Exemption of duty on import or domestic procurement of goods for development, operation and maintenance of SEZ units
- A 100% tax exemption on export income for SEZ units for the first five years, 50% for the next five years thereafter and 50% of the ploughed back export profit for the next five years
- Exemption of Central Sales Tax, Service tax and state sales tax, as well as various other levies by the government
- Fast processing of all required approvals and compliances in a single-window mechanism

Start-ups

Knowing the importance of start-ups in the modern business ecosystem, the government provides special packages to start-ups to support their growth to enable them become tomorrow's unicorns. The state-level tax (SGST) will be reimbursed for a maximum turnover of INR 10 million for the first three years of operation. The Telangana government will reimburse 30% of the annual marketing cost of start-ups in international trade shows (maximum of INR 500,000).

Incubators are also given extra incentives. The government would reimburse 20% of the capital invested (maximum of INR 3 million) for a minimum investment of INR 10 million. For incubators that have raised funding from the Government of India, the state government will provide additional funding that would match the Government of India's contribution (maximum of INR 5 million).

To further promote the start-up ecosystem, the government formed the Telangana State Innovation Cell (TSIC). Under TSIC, many initiatives are run like the Government Mentor Program where government officials provide mentorship to start-ups for give them market access. Other initiatives include workshops with industry leaders and venture capitalists. To promote entrepreneurship in tier II and III cities of the state, TSIC conducted a 20-day India Telangana Start-up Yatra. As part of this initiative, a mobile van was instituted to spread awareness about initiatives taken by the government to promote entrepreneurship. The vehicle had experts on board who provide an opportunity for entrepreneurial talents to pitch ideas.

Recognising the importance of IT and related industries, Telangana has dedicated state policies and vision statements for the development of various segments such as gaming and animation, data centres, cyber security, IoT and data analytics.

Consultative Committee on Information Technology Industry (CCITI)

A major step in improving the IT business ecosystem is the formation of the CCITI. Set up in May 1999, the CCITI is a joint committee with representatives from the government and the ICT industry for administering the incentives to the ICT industry in a smooth manner, and for effectively resolving issues, overcoming the impediments and ensuring growth of the ICT industry in the state.

The CCITI administers the incentives on specific applications made by an ICT company. These applications are scrutinised by the sub-committee of the CCITI headed by the Special Secretary, ITE&C, in association with industry representatives, on the eligibility, veracity of technical/financial information, etc., prior to placing it before the CCITI for its consideration. The incentives considered by this committee include:

common fiscal incentives for all companies, sector-specific incentives and facilitation, state incentives for IT SEZs / IT Parks / IT campuses / ITIR and SEZ incentives offered by the Government of India.

Gaming and Animation Policy

The government is also looking to enable other industries that require niche skill sets. It has come up with incentives exclusively for the animation, visual effects, gaming and comics (AVGC) companies. This is in addition to the policies that support the IT industry. Thanks to such policies, global gaming giants like EA Sports and multinational animation company Digital Domain and many others have set up offices in Hyderabad.

Incentive Package for Gaming and Animation Industry



AVGC

- Government is in the process of setting up "IMAGE city" to act as a center of Excellence for Animation, Visual effects, Gaming & Comics
- 25% of the capital (Maximum of INR 2.5M) invested will be reimbursed
- 20% of the production costs (maximum of INR 500K) for animated series, online, mobile & console games produced in Telangana will be reimbursed
- Entertainment tax is exempted
- 25% of lease paid for the rented spaces (Maximum of INR 500K) is reimbursed for three years
- INR 1.5M directly transferred to the companies on successful hiring of 100 people in the first two years of operation
- Reimbursement of 20% of expenditure occurred for quality certifications like ISO, CE, CCC and other AVGC specific industry certifications
- 50% of rental charges and delegate registration charges (Maximum of INR 500K) are reimbursed for the companies for participating in national and international conferences, exhibitions and events related to AVGC industry

Telangana VFX, Animation and Gaming Association (TVAGA)

TVAGA is an association of industry leaders in animation, VFX, gaming and comics working closely with the government, studios, producers and other stakeholders to promote the media and entertainment ecosystem in Hyderabad. vii TVAGA organises the annual Indiajoy event – the largest Indian congregation of media and entertainment events.

Society for Cyberabad Security Council (SCSC)

SCSC is an IT industry body that works with Cyberabad police to empower the IT industry and address their safety and security needs. Through SCSC, the IT industry is guarded against information security threats, fire and other safety issues, sabotage operations and terrorist threats. SCSC puts special emphasis on women safety by instituting programmes like women conclaves, Margadarshak (Mentor) programme and safety awareness sessions. SCSC has a dedicated cyber security forum that collaborates with the industry leaders and has knowledge-sharing tools and sessions on best international practices.

For startups achieving a minimum of 15% growth, Telangana state will reimburse 5% of total turnover of the company up to a maximum of INR 1M for the first three years of operation.

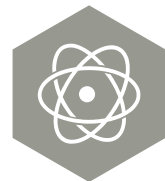


Blockchain District

Telangana is the first state in India to conceptualise its own Blockchain policy. The government aims to develop Hyderabad as one of the top 10 Blockchain cities in the world.



India's first Blockchain district will be set up in Hyderabad and will have an ecosystem housing Blockchain technology companies, incubators and research facilities. The city of Hyderabad is uniquely positioned to take a leadership role in the development of Blockchain technologies due to the presence of companies in Financial Services, Capital Markets, Insurance, Health, Education and other Consumer services, which can leverage the technology. It will contain a centre of excellence, a state-of-the-art incubator for Blockchain technologies, and an ecosystem for housing Blockchain companies and research facilities.



Research & Innovation

- Common platform for academic institutions and industry to come together
- Government fund for setting up research chairs in prominent institutions and scholarships in this domain to boost Blockchain related research
- Collaboration between government and corporates to establish research fellowships



Talent pool

- Blockchain courses to engineering students to be delivered by TASK
- Elite certification program for a select few professionals

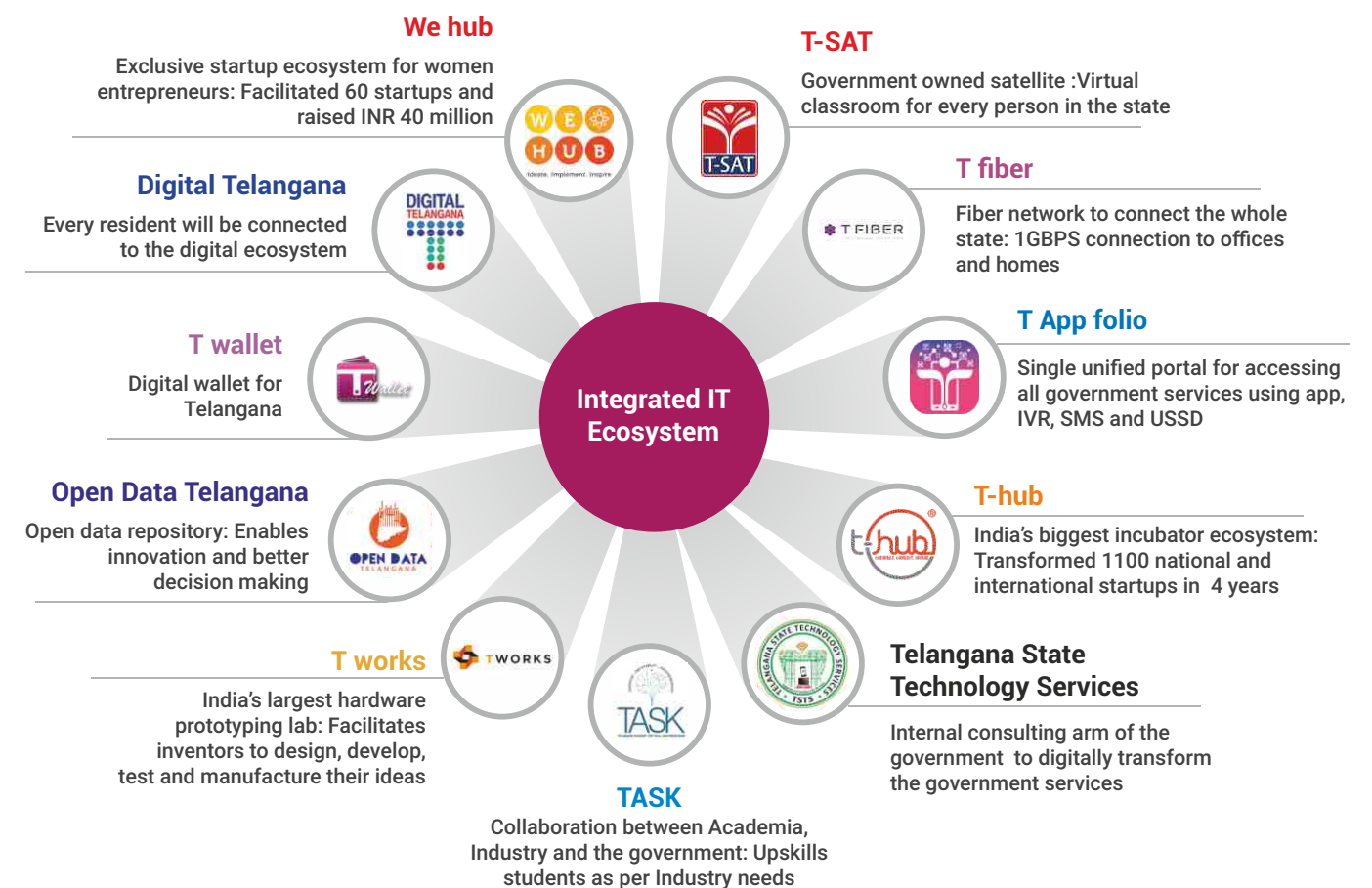

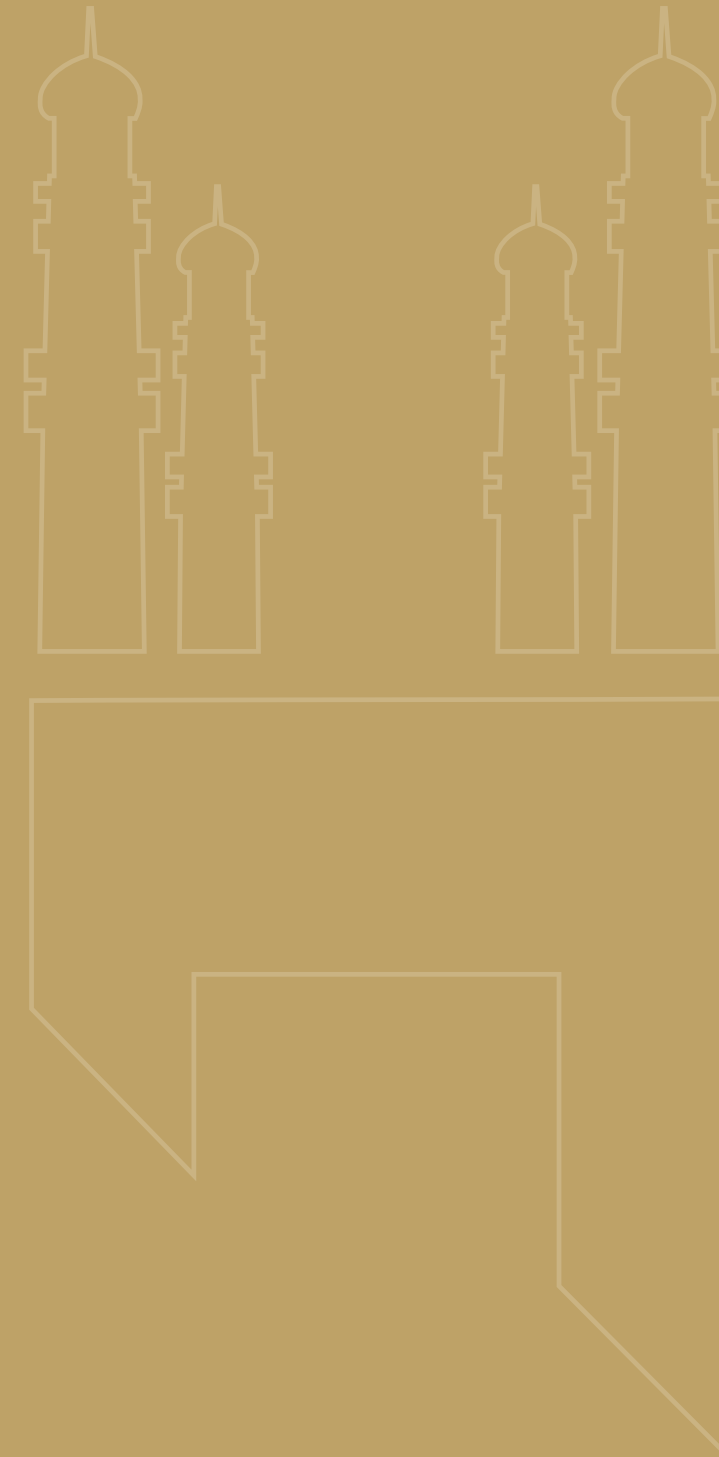

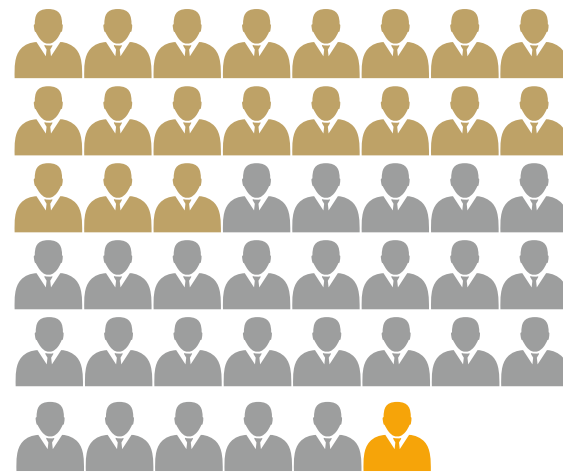

Culture and City Livability



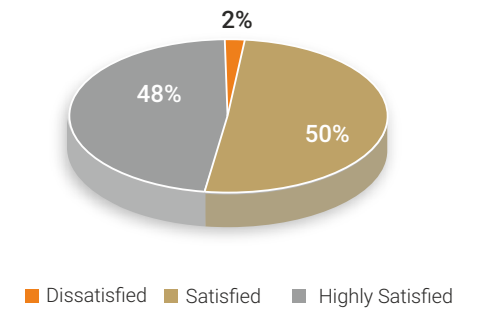

A comparison of Hyderabad with other metro cities in India

Leading tech company with substantial presence in Hyderabad for the past few years

Hyderabad definitely ranks amongst the top cities when it comes to safety. The police department is progressive - employing qualified personnel and regularly (and knowledgeably) connecting with the industry.

- a. As per a survey by a leading newspaper, women rated Hyderabad as the **safest city in India**.
- b. The police has formed a special initiative called the **SHE Team**, which has gone a long way to secure the city as a safe place for women. There are also **SHE shuttles** – transport system dedicated to women – ensuring that women safety is kept at the highest priority.
- c. In mid-2018, the Telangana government prioritised women's safety in the region by setting up the 'Women Safety Wing', which has further strengthened the 'SHE Teams' initiative. The wing headed by the Inspector General of Police has begun phased training sessions and will soon be a functional asset to the state's commitment towards women's safety.
- d. **Cyberabad security:** Cyberabad is equipped with CCTV cameras and dedicated police patrolling. Hyderabad already has 500,000 CCTV cameras installed and this number is set to triple in the coming three years.
- e. The government has commissioned the building of twin towers – a 20- and 15-storied building having 550,000 square feet area on a seven-acre land in Banjara Hills. Once completed, the command and control centre can house representatives of various government departments in one place. It will help in monitoring of big events in the city, and will improve operational efficiencies.

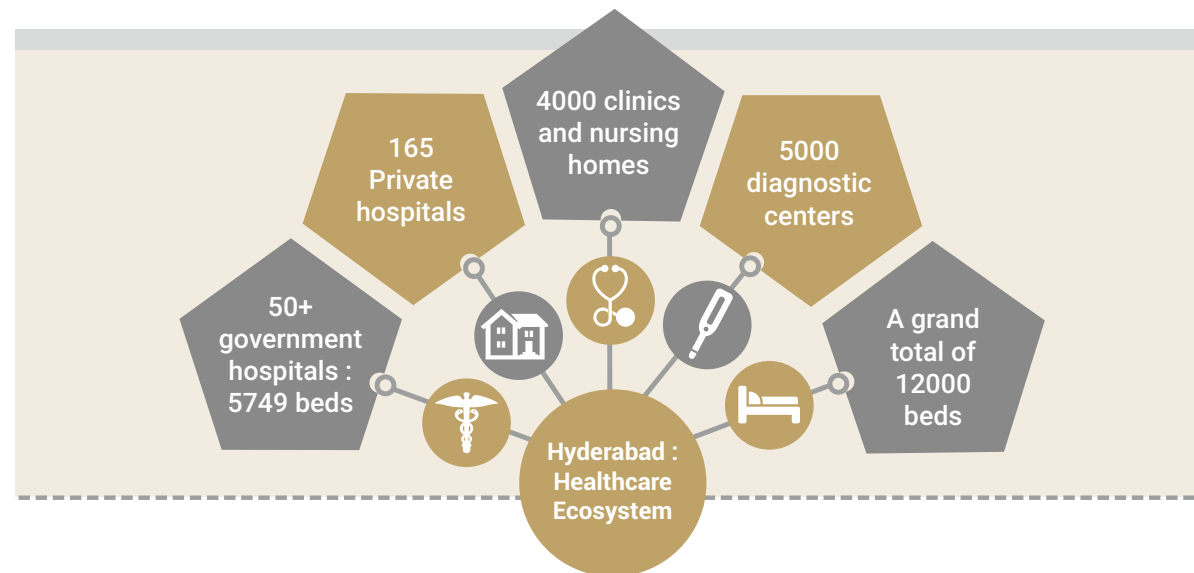


Healthcare and Primary Education

The diverse set of options ensure that all requirements related to education are met.

4. Aquatics Complex: With a capacity of 2000+ spectators, it is a dedicated complex for swimming, diving, water polo and synchronised events.

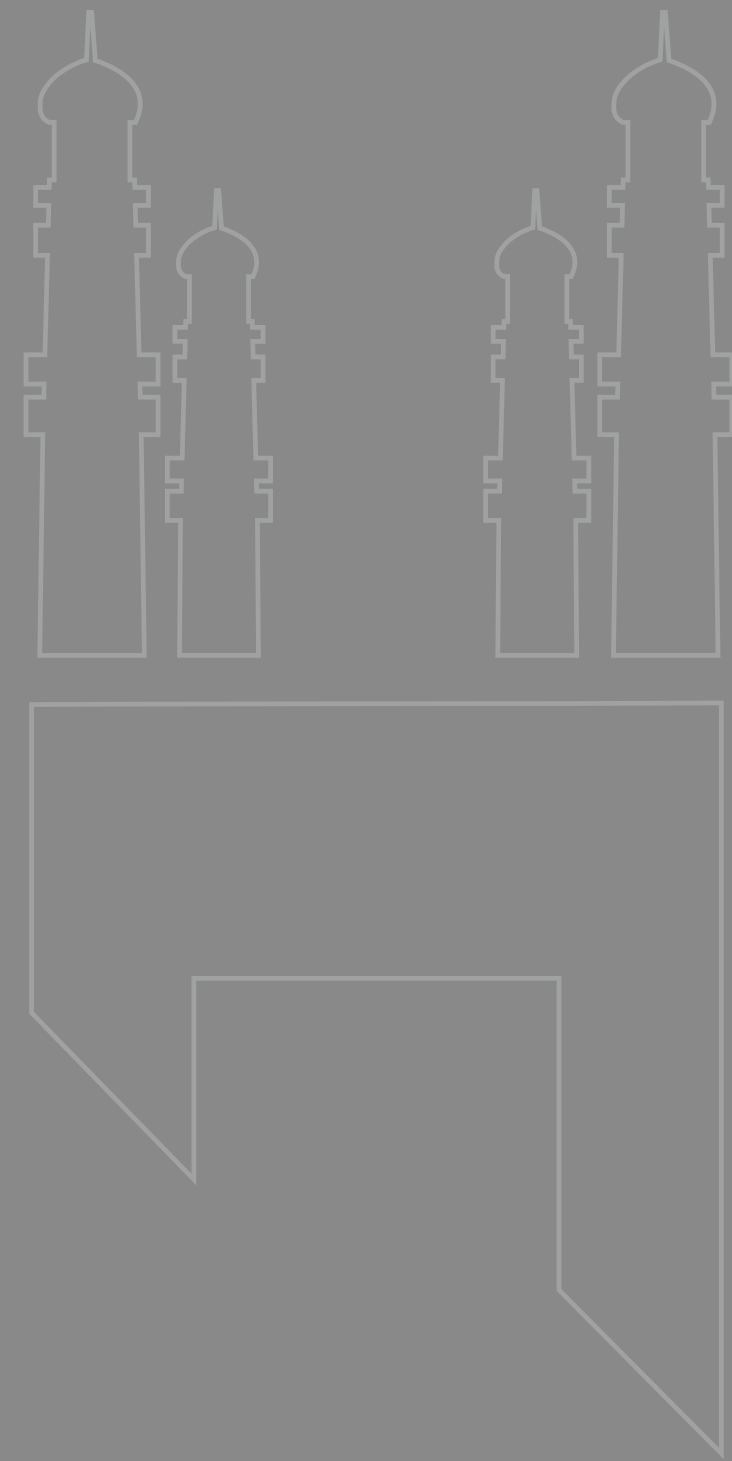
